At Wellington College we provide an excellent range of opportunities for our pupils both in and out of the classroom. These opportunities allow our students to develop both academically and as young people who are equipped to make a difference in society. They are central to Wellington's caring ethos, our tradition as a grammar school, and our mission to engage, educate and empower young people.

We are dependent on parental contributions to the College Fund to continue to provide these opportunities. For the school year 2019/2020 the contribution required is £60 for each child in the family - indeed the College is grateful to some parents who contribute more than the requested amount.

The College Fund is used to:


- Subsidise transport, equipment and coaching support for sports and musical activities;
- Support the wide range of clubs and activities we offer, including the College library, and provide materials and costs for events outside the school day;
- Provide funding for Sixth Form events, the talks programme, and Sixth Form facilities;
- Purchase materials and enrich the curriculum in practical subjects including Home Economics, Art and Technology & Design;
- Provide insurance cover for all pupils during Games and other activities through registration with the IRFU and other sports bodies;
- Provide limited cover for loss or damage to personal belongings in school.

We ask that you pay your college fund through standing order and have enclosed a form for your use which needs to be returned to the college with your pupil information form. Paying through standing order means your monthly payments will stay the same for the duration of your child's stay in Wellington, that is £5.00 per calendar month per child.

I am asking for your support in this matter and I trust you will appreciate how important your contribution is to our work and to the education of your child.
